





"I have made the rule never to speak with anybody about divorce, until I have first spoken with him (or her) about two other subjects, namely, marriage and reconciliation. Sometimes a discussion of these topics makes a discussion of the other unnecessary. At the very least, it is only when a person has understood and accepted God's view of marriage and God's culture reconciliation that a possible context has been created in which one may regretfully go on to to talk about divorce. This principle of pastoral priorities is, I believe, consistent with the teaching of Jesus."
